

#### **IMPORTANT CHURCH GUIDANCE**

As the Covid-19 restrictions have been relaxed over the last few months we have welcomed more members and visitors attending church services. However, in recent weeks the rates of Covid cases in Northampton have been fluctuating.

As a precaution for the health and safety of everyone I have made the decision that face coverings are worn and social distancing reinstated in College Street.

I am encouraging everyone to remain cautious and observe to the following:

- All attendees will have their temperature checked on arrival. If you have a temperature of 37.8 degrees Celsius or above, you and your travelling companions will be asked to return home, self-isolate and seek medical attention.
- Hand sanitizer stations will remain at the entrance and exit of the building, please use these as often as you can.
- All attendees are encouraged to wear a face covering/ mask in the main sanctuary.
- If you choose not to wear a face covering/mask, please continue to maintain social distance with others.
- Follow the Steward's instructions as they direct you to your seat.

- It is essential that if you have Covid symptoms, however mild, or test positive for Covid, please inform a member of the Leadership team, and follow the Government guidelines. Most importantly, please do not attend church to ensure the safety of others.
- If you feel anxious, please speak to Colleen Coates of the Pastoral Care team. Be assured we will take care of you and the safety of all our members and friends.
- Any further changes will be reviewed as guided by data from Government and Public Health. We will ensure that you are informed before any formal decisions are made.

We continue to focus on ensuring that **everyone** that comes into our church can worship in a safe environment and we will continue to do so by God's grace.

She is the author of 'Silent Whispers of the Soul,' 'Prayer Flames,' 'Lavender of Purple,' and 'The Call.'

Together with her husband Paul, they have raised three responsible young men and have always availed her time to support and work with young people. Brigette enjoys listening to music, worshipping, dancing, swimming, and travelling. **Sharon. P. Scott,** MBA, MCMI, AMCIPD, MAMBA, BSc is mother to 13 yr. old Jayda and 15 Yr. Ruel. She is also wife to Ken Scott who Pastors NTCG Dayspring Church in Mitcham.

Having enjoyed over 21yrs in the NHS where she has worked; first, as an operations Manager until recently where she transferred her skills to programme management at NHS England and Improvement, she published her first novel, Orchids and Roses in 2020 and recently published Visions From My Father in July this year.



Ι was born in Belize SO that makes me а Belizean. I came England to in March 1995 and 📓 lived in Uxbridge,

Middlesex before my husband and I moved to Northampton in the spring of 1997.

My parents encouragement and prayers were and still are important and much appreciated facets of my life. My Dad advised me to find a Bible based Church. My husband noted the publicity on the College St NTCG which seemed to match our search and so he wrote to the Church for further information. We are not sure what happened to our letter as we never did get a response but we visited the church after а while and became members, three months later we were both water baptised.

I have remained a member of the church particularly because I like the worship services. I enjoy the singing. I am very impressed with the new worship team. I think Sis Jacina Abbey contributes a special blessing to our worship service. I admire her effort. I also like the prayer ministry and often respond to the call for prayer at the altar in support of the needs of members of my family and friends.

Over recent years, I have become more resilient in my faith. College St has been a source of reference for me in more ways than one. Through all the ups and downs I have learnt to rely on the Lord as we have been taught through the sermons and Bible classes The recent 'lockdown' caused me to feel lonely at times. Thankfully I have a caring and loving family from whom I received a lot of support. lot drew а of encouragement and support from the 'Daily Bread' which I used in my daily devotions and from which I gained a lot of insights and encouragement from the commentary about the experience of other people in the bible and in

today's world in ways that I could relate. These were all very helpful because I am not IT savvy and so found it challenging to access the online church activities but I have plans to gain the skills in the not too distant future .

When I look back, I can honestly say, the months under lockdown were rough for me BUT I can also say in all honesty that God was good to me. I learnt to draw more from God. Three scriptures became very important to me during that time:

'This is the day that the Lord has made; we will rejoice and be glad in it.' Psalm 118:24

'Trust in the Lord .. and lean not on your own understanding...and he shall direct your paths.' Proverbs 3:5-6 and

'I will lead you by ways not known to you.' Isaiah 42:16

I would encourage my brothers and sisters at College Street to reflect on these verses of Scripture and draw what you can from them to strengthen you. I appreciate the fellowship we have with each other and I pray that we will become more closer as a spiritual family and more engaging with each other. I also pray that we will become more supportive of new Christians , maybe through a bespoke mentoring programme for them.
