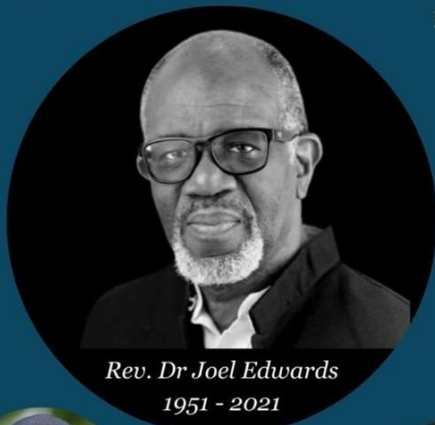

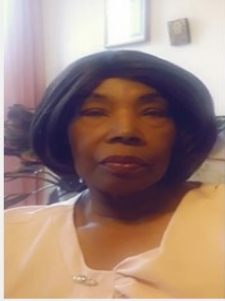

This is my Testimony

Sis Susan Wright



I was baptised in 1966 in the Parish of Manchester in Jamaica. My Christian journey has and continues to be simply awesome. For

example, the story of how I've come to live here in Northampton, England still amazes me. I had a vision whilst in Jamaica in which I saw myself in a house in Northampton. At the time I only knew of an aunt in Birmingham. At the time when I had the vision, I met a woman who was caring for three children because their mother was poorly, and she told me that the doctors had given up on her. I told my mum the full story as the lady had shared with me and I said to my Mum, 'What can I give her?' My mum sent me to my Grandma to find out what she thought we could do to help. My Grandma made some porridge and some advice to bed-bath her which I did over a few weeks. During this time, I was guided by the Holy

Spirit about how to keep her warm. Over the course of time, I learnt that she had been living in Northampton and her husband was still in England in the air force.

Over the next few weeks, the lady regained her health, and we contacted her husband, and he came to Jamaica. Whilst in Jamaica and hearing of my care and support of his wife and children, he decided to take me to England with them to which I agreed. The successful application for my passport is another story of the Lord at work in my life but space will not allow for this. Suffice it to say, when I got to England, the house looked just like the one I saw in my vision. I have three sayings that I learnt from this part of my Christian life: one. The Lord will always make a way where there seems to be no way, two: Always help people, nothing is too good to give away and three: We are blessed to be a blessing.

How I came to be at NTCG is another story of how God speaks to me through visions. In 1994, I saw the church in Standens Barn, Northampton in a vision before I knew anything about this NTCG branch in Northampton. Again, space does not allow me to go into the details here. There were only a few people there, but the fellowship was lovely. My son, Jamie and the other young people sang in the choir. The few of us worked hard to raise funds for the things we needed such as a new Church van. Then I had a vision to purchase a church building instead of a church van and we worked together to raise the money. What and how we did this is another long story. But what I learned about God through all of this, is that he has given every one of us at least one talent to use for his glory if we allow him to do so. He has a plan for each one of us and if we are connected to the Holy Spirit, we will know what to do and when to do it. The Peterborough NTCG was very supportive at this time, and I remember them with gratitude. Another thing I have learnt is that in the midst of life, bad things can happen to us and some of us can suffer from

mistreatment along the way. But through it all we can make it. Eph 2:8-10 speaks loud and clear to me. 'We are all a work in progress'. The Lord wants to develop us to be like Jesus and if we allow him to change us, it will happen.

The pandemic is a case in point. It has affected everyone in many different ways. Some people ended up very lonely. However, during lockdown I was never lonely, I firmly believe God when he says he will never leave nor forsake us. And I can say I got closer to God during this time. I gained a greater understanding of how we should live as Christians. We are our brothers' and sisters' keepers. We should be there for each other. Make ourselves available to each other. I pray that we will see more of this at College Street. I am also praying that visitors to our Church, including those from Eastern Europe, will find us to be a caring Church and feel welcome to stay and become a part of our fellowship.

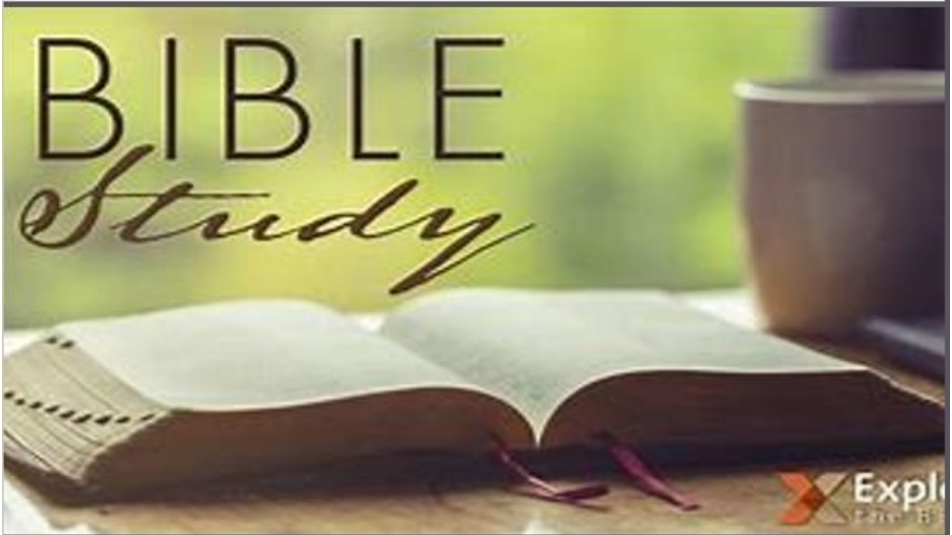

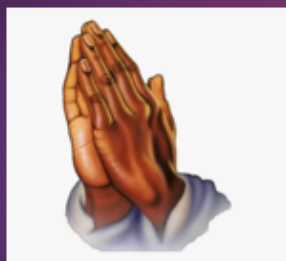

IMPORTANT CHURCH GUIDANCE

As the Covid-19 restrictions have been relaxed over the last few months we have welcomed more members and visitors attending church services. However, in recent weeks the rates of Covid cases in Northampton have been fluctuating.

As a precaution for the health and safety of everyone I have made the decision that face coverings are worn and social distancing reinstated in College Street.

I am encouraging everyone to remain cautious and observe to the following:

- ❖ All attendees will have their temperature checked on arrival. If you have a temperature of 37.8 degrees Celsius or above, you and your travelling companions will be asked to return home, self-isolate and seek medical attention.
- ❖ Hand sanitizer stations will remain at the entrance and exit of the building, please use these as often as you can.
- ❖ All attendees are encouraged to wear a face covering/mask in the main sanctuary.
- ❖ If you choose not to wear a face covering/mask, please continue to maintain social distance with others.
- ❖ Follow the Steward's instructions as they direct you to your seat.

- ❖ **It is essential that if you have Covid symptoms, however mild, or test positive for Covid, please inform a member of the Leadership team, and follow the Government guidelines. Most importantly, please do not attend church to ensure the safety of others.**
- ❖ If you feel anxious, please speak to Colleen Coates of the Pastoral Care team. Be assured we will take care of you and the safety of all our members and friends.
- ❖ Any further changes will be reviewed as guided by data from Government and Public Health. We will ensure that you are informed before any formal decisions are made.

We continue to focus on ensuring that **everyone** that comes into our church can worship in a safe environment and we will continue to do so by God's grace.
